Jane Addams (1860-1935)

Co-founder, Chicago's Hull House (1889), feminist, suffragist, internationalist, political activist, pacifist and prolific author. A disciple of Lincoln, Tolstoy, and Gandhi, Addams was an astute critic of Gilded Age capitalism and advocate for women, children, immigrants, and other vulnerable people. In 1931 she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.
